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Secondly, check the intent and see to it that it is realistic. Question yourself Is your intent realistic? They have learnt the art of infusing love into work. Anybody who wants to be at the top has to be a 'great giver'. And if you have to be a great giver, you need to 'have' what you chose to give. To have much you need to 'learn'. To contribute more, you need to grow more and for that you need to learn more. Ex: If your need is importance or love, then for 7 continuous days no matter what, give that love and importance to the other.
